The FAQs about NPs and PAs

Answers to frequently asked questions about nurse practitioners and physician assistants

What are Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants?

- Both nurse practitioners and physician assistants work with physicians to provide quality health care to patients.
- A Nurse Practitioner (NP) is a registered nurse who is prepared, through advanced education and clinical training, to provide preventive and acute health care services to individuals of all ages.
- A physician assistant (PA) is a medical professional who works as part of a team with a doctor. A PA is a graduate of an accredited PA educational program who is nationally certified and state-licensed to practice medicine with the supervision of a physician.

What do Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants do?

- Administer physical exams
- Diagnose and treat acute and chronic conditions
- Focus on prevention, wellness and education
- Prescribe medications
- Refer patients to other healthcare professionals as needed

What education and training does an NP and PA undergo to become certified?

- All NPs must complete a master's or doctoral degree program, and have advanced clinical training beyond their initial professional registered nurse preparation.
- All PAs attend a physician assistant program that is modeled on the medical school curriculum with a combination of classroom and clinical instruction. The PA course of study is rigorous and intense, and the average length of a PA education program is 27 months.
